June 2022

Financial Literacy Exchange
Program based on a pilot program
developed by CASA of the 7th
Judicial District to encourage
employment, increase net-worth,
and provide financial literacy to
individuals living in supportive
housing.

December 2021

First tenants move into 1st Place on Palmer; a six unit, supportive housing project serving the needs of homeless young adults in Delta County

October 2021

CASA of the 7th Judicial District enters into a contract to purchase fifteen acres off the San Juan Bypass in Montrose for the development of a 33 unit supportive housing community meeting the needs of those 18 to 24, and 60+, at imminent risk for homelessness.

For Children and Youth within the Child Welfare System

- One third have a chronic health problem
- Up to 80 percent have a mental health issue
- Are three times more likely to use drugs
- The young women are more than twice as likely to become pregnant by age 19
- Of those emancipating from foster care, only 15.6 percent report part or full time employment






FINANCIAL POSITION
