

Mr Rogers said it well. Those who see the need and respond are my heroes. This past year CASA has been partnering with those who respond. Many of you may be reading this, thank you! We are incredibly grateful. While our efforts on behalf of children and youth suffering the effects of abuse and neglect have been strongly supported by community foundations, local governments, and private benefactors, we have also drawn the attention and support of state, national, and global philanthropists.

The CASA advocacy program, with 49 active Advocates, continues to provide a voice for children in the court through no fault of their own. This past year, CASA's Supervised Visitation Program, which is actively serving families in four counties, has seen a 15% growth in hours of visitation being provided. Fostering Futures, a program designed to meet the needs of youth and young adults coming out of foster care and transitioning to independence, is breaking new ground in innovative services and intervention. Over the past 12 months we have completed a \$1.2 million capital campaign to build eight homes that can be accessed regionally by 18 to 24 year olds that have come out of care and are at high risk for homelessness. Consultants have been brought in to identify potential outcomes and targeted benchmarks for ongoing assessments.

CASA of the 7th Judicial District is committed to our children. Their problems are our problems. Together we will respond and, perhaps, we can be their heroes..


SUPERVISED EXCHANGE & PARENTING TIME






Visitation is essential for a child's well-being

The primary purpose of visitation is to maintain the parent-child attachment, reduce a child's sense of abandonment, and preserve their sense of belonging as part of a family and community. A child needs to see and have regular contact with their parent(s), as this relationship is the foundation of child development.



A Fostering Futures Community

At the age of 18, youth in foster care are free to leave the system and go out on their own. Although legally they are adults, few are prepared to transition into adulthood.

After watching many of these youth struggle with homelessness, human trafficking, and addictions, CASA of the 7th Judicial District moved forward to develop a community of homes with on-site support through a "good neighbor"; a mentor and a friend that would be available to assist with the challenges that arise when leaving a system of care and moving towards independence.

D.J.'s Story

D.J. came in to our program through the "Tiny House Project" in the Fall of 2016. He was 15 years old and had been removed from both his biological parents and adoptive parents due to abuse. He really wasn't focused on much other than fun and friends. D.J. has now been in our program for nearly 2 years, learning the soft skills necessary to hold a job, succeed in school, and develop personal relationships. He has also developed permanent connections with several staff and volunteers, including his CASA advocate. D.J. is looking forward to college next year


